## 38th Street Rehabilitation from I-465 to I-65

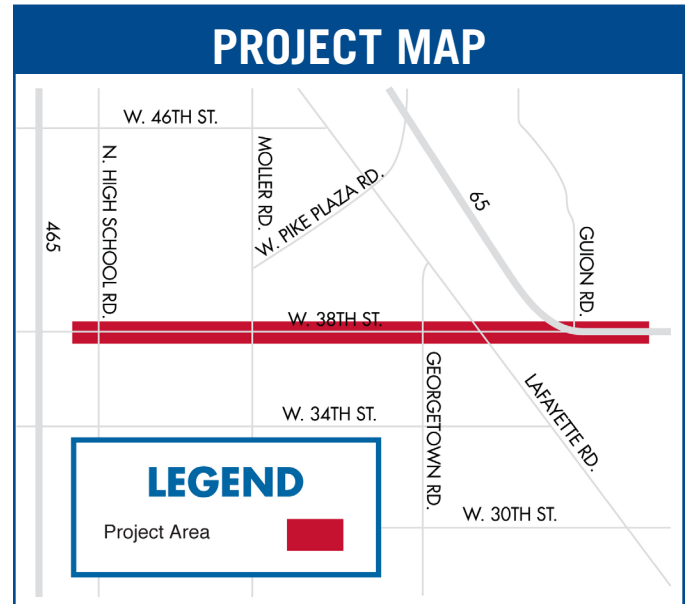
The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is working to improve aging infrastructure throughout Marion County. A rehabilitation improvement project is planned for the northwest side of Indianapolis along 38th Street from I-465 to I-65.

### PROJECT SCOPE

Since the 1960s, 38th Street has been a major thoroughfare for Indianapolis commuters. As a result, the six-lane street has deteriorated and is in need of complete rehabilitation. By 2019, more than 50,000 vehicles are projected to travel the street daily.

This project will include resurfacing of the concrete street with asphalt pavement. In addition, curbs, sidewalks, traffic signals and bridge decks over Guion Road and the CSX RR tracks will be replaced. Sodded medians, islands and landscaping are also planned improvements of the project.

Construction will span along 38th Street from just west of High School Road to east of Guion Road and the CSX RR tracks, as shown on the map. During construction, two lanes of traffic will be maintained in each direction.



### PROJECT DETAILS

Project Status: In Design

Anticipated Construction Period: Spring 2010 to late Fall 2011

Estimated Project Costs: Between \$15 - 20 million

- 80% Federal funding
- 20% Local match
